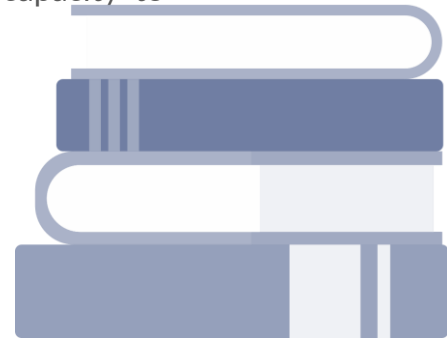

Summary

The failure to identify, at the very beginning of the criminal proceedings, the specific vulnerabilities of suspects or accused people with psycho-social and intellectual disabilities, and to communicate to them in an understandable way, might seriously harm their rights and at the same time might deprive first-line officers from making informed decisions about different aspects of the cases from coping crises to understanding motives. Practitioners from criminal justice authorities need to have at their disposal adequate tools to identify such persons, be aware of their special needs and have the capacity to implement the appropriate measures to ensure they are treated equally to all other suspects.

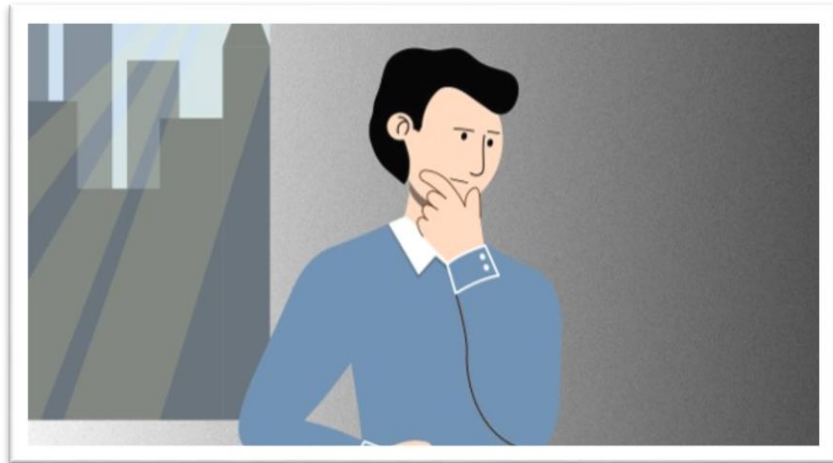
